## Safeguarding: Road Safety continued

As you are aware, following a safeguarding concern being raised by North Yorkshire Council, we have increased our monitoring of parking around school as well as encouraging families to cross a little further down Low Moor Lane away from the junction.

We are incredibly proud of the way in which the children have embraced this and are actively reminding their parents where is safest to cross. Miss Calvert hosted a meeting with head teachers from local rural schools this week who were very impressed to hear the children talking about safe places to cross the road.

Unfortunately, there are still a small number of parents/carers parking in the farm entrance across from school. Not only is this unsafe as it is necessary to cross the path that the children are using to exit onto the road, but this is private land and we have received a number of complaints from the landowner. Additionally, some parents/carers are parking on the yellow lines and zig zags outside school to drop off and collect children from after school clubs. These road markings are in place to keep your children safe. It is unsafe, and illegal, to park in this area and we would respectfully request that you find a more suitable and safe place to park.

Whilst it may seem an inconvenience to walk or park a little further from school, we ask that you do so to ensure the safety of all children. We would ask that respect is shown to all staff and governors who are supporting the safety drive. Please ensure this information is passed onto anyone collecting children on your behalf.

# **Weekly Attendance Figures**

Class 1 - 98.85%

Class 2 – 96.76%

Class 3 - 100%

Well done to Class 3 who achieved 100% attendance this week! The expectation is that schools maintain an attendance level of at least 97%. This is the measure that schools are subject to during both local and national inspections. Figures below that level will be heavily criticized. We appreciate your support with this. It is also a legal requirement for children to attend school regularly. Please ensure that children are in school and on time every day and please avoid term time holidays.

Over 97% 90 – 97% Under 90%

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Whilst 95% attendance doesn't sound too bad, across a year it means your child would have missed 9 days of school, or 45 lessons. Over 7 years of primary school, 95% attendance each year would add up to 12.5 weeks or 3 months or one whole term of missed school.
