## Excellence in Maths

On Thursday, we hosted a mixed age maths Teacher Research Group (TRG) for the Yorkshire Ridings Maths Hub. We were incredibly privileged that Dr Debbie Morgan CBE from the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics (NCETM) joined the teachers, headteachers and maths specialists at the meeting.

Debbie joined the NCETM in 2012, and, since 2014, has led the work of introducing teaching for mastery approaches to maths in primary schools across England. In that time, working alongside the national network of Maths Hubs, Debbie has trained and influenced many thousands of teachers. As a result, hundreds of thousands of primary school pupils have developed a more secure and more lasting mathematical understanding.

This work is the culmination of an entire working life devoted to primary education, during which time Debbie has moved from class teacher to headteacher, and on to advisory and teacher-training roles with local authorities and universities. In 2015, she completed her doctorate with the Open University, which focused on the development of primary teachers' mathematics subject knowledge.

In addition, she has found time to be the maths consultant on the BAFTA award-winning CBeebies programme Numberblocks.

We are thrilled that Debbie left our school impressed at the 'inspirational' teaching she observed. This is great recognition of the work that Miss Alvarez has, and continues to do to ensure that maths teaching, not only in her own class, but across the school, is excellent.
This is further recognition of the high quality teaching and learning that is everyday practice in our school. Well done and massive thanks to all staff for their ongoing hard work and dedication. You can read Dr Debbie Morgan's comments about her visit here.

## DID YOU KNOW?

Whilst $95 \%$ attendance doesn't sound too bad, across a year it means your child would have missed 9 days of school, or 45 lessons. Over 7 years of primary school, $95 \%$ attendance each year would add up to 12.5 weeks or 3 months or one whole term of missed school.
