PE and School Sport Premium Report 2014



The government provides funding for primary schools to develop PE and sport provision. This ring-fenced funding has been allocated for 2013-2014, 2014-2015 and 2015-2016. It is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport.

The following document explains how Scotton Lingerfield Primary School has allocated the PE and Sports Premium. Due to the size of our school, the potential for identifying pupils through the publishing of any funding report is inevitably greater. For this reason, it is our policy to publish a basic outline of how we have spent, and plan to spend, our PE and Sports Premium allocations.

Principles of using PE and Sports funding at Scotton Lingerfield Primary School

- The money will directly impact on the quality of teaching and learning in PE lessons
- Funding will be directed towards the professional development of teaching and support staff to develop their ability to deliver high quality PE and school sport
- Through team teaching with specialist PE teachers and coaches alongside staff training sessions, staff will improve the subject knowledge and ability to deliver high quality PE and school sport.
- Funding will be targeted to ensure provision for all learners provides appropriate levels of challenge and support.
- Targeted resourcing will ensure that all pupils may appropriately access equipment to engage and participate fully throughout all aspects of PE
- Funding will facilitate the development of leadership of PE across our school, thus ensure sustained improvement.

PE and Sport Premium Provision

Breakdown of how the money is used to support the identified needs of our pupils in order to improve provision of physical education we:

Activity Aim Impact 2013-2014 Allocation =£976

- Membership of local school sports partnership. **Access improved to training, equipment loan and competition**
- Staff professional development through shared teaching opportunities with expert practitioners. **Improved observation of learning, pupil engagement and assessment practices.**
- Specifically funded additional cricket coaching. **Improved sign posting and links with local town club.**
- Additional resources and equipment. **Equipment and resources available for use, raising the quality of provision and learning opportunities.**
